"Without shedding of blood is no remission." HEB. ix. 22.

We shall find this is not a mere solitary text of Holy Scripture; but the basis of all Scripture, from Genesis to Revelation. It is all-important, however, to notice the position man is in, since the fall, as recorded in Gen. iii: "Therefore the Lord God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken.
